ALLOCATION OF AAUW FUND\$

Throughout an AAUW year from July 1 to June 30, the Virginia Beach branch earns considerable money to support our projects. At some point, the Board of Directors approves a budget which determines how these funds are allocated. I ask you to consider the following.

Many members think local scholarships and awards provide more visible community outreach, give the branch more control over use of the money we earn, inspire young girls, and give women in need the financial support that enables them to return to college to complete their degrees. Nationally, our branch is one of many that feels this way.

Others point out that Virginia Beach branch has contributed much to the national organization. We've supported AAUW research on relevant topics and have contributed to multiple AAUW endowments that support, and will continue to support, post graduate education for women. It's long been felt that AAUW's support for post graduate education is a strong driver of systemic change because the women selected to receive this money are among the best and the brightest women whose future work may well impact millions of people.

Another AAUW iron in the fire includes support for female college educators justifiably seeking but denied tenure, redress for discrimination, and justice in sexual harassment cases. Often women are not able to stand up alone against a college or university's money and power. Virginia Beach branch has regularly contributed funds for this work, as well.

Most recently, AAUW launched a series of far-reaching projects aimed at young women, projects focusing on STEM education, landing a good job, how to negotiate fair pay, how to run for political office, and more. What a boost for this population!

What I've written thus far might not include all we have done, but what is accurate is that we are a branch of AAUW, not an independent club. We subscribe to AAUW's mission, goals, and efforts to support women and girls. Without AAUW we'd simply be another gaggle of women, a small group with relatively small clout, and likely a group destined for the dust heap. Through its extensive network, trusted national reputation (especially on Capitol Hill and through our research) and multiple diverse efforts to support women and girls, AAUW gives us life, and a highly respected life at that.

Bottom line, let's continue to support the many talented women and girls who've come before our branch and wowed us with their determination and accomplishments, but let us never forget the true source of our widest reaching, greatest successes for women, AAUW.

Pennies for Prescriptions - \$15 for 15 years

Can you do it? If you have been around as long as I have, perhaps you remember back in 2003, when we began "Pennies for Prescriptions." Many loved the idea and within the first two years, we collected more than \$1000. At that time, we were funding up to one annual \$50 pharmacy voucher per person via VB Social Services. That means a \$1000 contribution would cover AT LEAST 20 vouchers and maybe more. Most who benefited were single mothers and children. Later, the Board opted to assist the Virginia Beach Free Clinic. This year, in celebration of this project, let us see if we cannot each collect \$15. In years past, banks let us put out collection jars, people solicited their friends and faith groups, employers were supportive, people raided couch cushions and glove boxes and the funds streamed in. One of my favorite donors was a coworker who contributed a 1950s Coleman picnic thermos filled to the brim with coins she had inherited from her father. She was so glad to hand it over. People were generous and we had fun. I have my \$15 ready and I hope you will join me!
