This is a great time to be a member of AAUW! AAUW Virginia is energized with its goals of ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) and supporting pay equity legislation, and that energy is filtering down across the state. State co-vice president for public policy Sylvia Rogers spoke on individual branches' efforts to pass the ERA in Virginia at the Southeast District meeting.

AAUW has worked for ratification of the ERA since 1971 and for pay equity since doing research on the gender pay gap in 1896. We have waited long enough for these. It's time to engage our state lawmakers. We can make it happen if each one of us gets involved in branch efforts. The support and involvement of each one of us is needed for passage of these laws to be successful.

AAUW has begun a movement to close the gender pay gap, and they are counting on us to help. Work Smart is a program that is empowering women to negotiate for a raise, promotion, or new job. It's now available online for free. Every member is asked to take an hour to go through the tool to get first-hand experience and to share the course with 20 of your friends, family members, and other acquaintances. Let's be the first branch with 100% participation! See the article for details.

PROPOSED BYLAWS AMENDMENT

This is the current bylaw which I propose amending:

ARTICLE XIV. Financial Administration. Section 2.c. Dues of new Individual Members may be paid at any time. New Individual Members joining the Affiliate between January 1 and March 15 shall pay one-half of the annual state and Affiliate dues. Payment of full annual dues by a new member between March 15 and December 31 shall cover membership through June 30 of the following year.

I propose deleting the second sentence.

Rationale: AAUW National has already deleted the half-year dues rate from January 1 March 15. Since, branch bylaws do not include state provisions, we may drop "state." Deleting the branch portion keeps us in line with National. The Virginia Beach Board has approved this.
