Nikki McCray is entering her third season as the head coach of the ODU Lady Monarchs basketball team. Her resume is impressive. In college, she played for the ever-dominant Lady Vols (U. Tenn). After graduating, she went on to play for several WNBA teams, and was named to three WNBA All-Star teams. She has also played on two Olympic gold-medal teams. She came to the Lady Monarchs after helping to coach the South Carolina Gamecocks to a national championship.

In addition to her career on the court, McCray also created a name for herself in the realm of community service. In 1999 The Library of Congress selected Nikki McCray to be the keynote speaker for the Women's History Month Address. In 2000, McCray was hand-picked by President Bill Clinton to be made a member of the President's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports.

We welcome Coach McCray as she tells her story of how a woman has excelled in a sport that once excluded women.

Do you remember that the Coca-Cola Foundation offered a \$150,000 grant to AAUW if we could train 100,000 women using the Work Smart/Start Smart program by August 2019? Not only did we meet that goal, but we exceeded it. According to Kendra Davis, AAUW Senior Vice-President of Advancement and Partnerships, more than 102,000 people have been trained using Work Smart and Start Smart. Because of the success of this program, a new application will be submitted to Coca-Cola for an additional \$500,000 to support AAUW's ongoing efforts to close the wage gap by providing women with the skills they need to negotiate starting salaries or raises. A big thank you goes out to all of you who signed up for the training or passed along the information about this opportunity to friends and family. Keep in mind that pay equity is an ongoing mission for AAUW, so continue to encourage anyone you know to take advantage of this free online opportunity for training.

Also, the importance of the November 5, 2019, elections in Virginia cannot be overstated. Please pass the word on to anyone you know who might not realize the impact of this election on the drawing of district lines next year. How Virginia votes in this mid-term election is being watched by the nation because the outcome could have an impact on the presidential election next year. Joy, a single mother, expressed her appreciation for the scholarship which is helping her pursue her Doctor of Pharmacy degree.

Our Virginia Beach AAUW Branch raises funds every year to award at least one \$500 scholarship to advance the education of women. Women who apply should meet the following criteria:

- Resident of Virginia Beach
- At least 23 years old
- Currently enrolled in an undergraduate program in Hampton Roads
- Completed a minimum of 15 credit hours at an accredited 2- or 4-year institution
- Returned to school after a lapse in time
- Minimum GPA of 3.0
