Ms. Carvey enlisted in the Navy in 1963 upon graduating from high school. Until 1972, women who wanted to serve in the US Navy were called "WAVES" and had limited opportunities for advancement and career paths. Ms. Carvey was a WAVE through the 1960s and will take us back to her experiences both in the service AND in her experience with a national organization of women who served in the WAVES.

As a WAVE, she worked as a journalist in the Public Affairs Office as well as for a base newspaper. She was separated from the service - as was the standard practice- when she was pregnant with her first child. After a child-rearing hiatus, she returned to government service (non-military) until 2006. However, her experience with the WAVES continues to influence her life. She served as president of WAVES National for four years. When the organization expanded to include all service women, she became first president of Military Women Across the Nation.

She has spoken at various commands in the area for Women's History Month as well as at the Defense Logistics Agency, Richmond, VA, in recognition of the Navy's birthday, 2 years ago.

- Expand Opportunities for Women and Girls in STEM


Foundational Rights
