#### **VOTING 2020**

How do you encourage voter turn-out in the midst of a pandemic? Not being able to coordinate our usual voter registration drives necessitated some change in strategy. The Virginia Beach Branch decided that posting yard signs in members front lawns might remind people to vote. And, while we were at it, we tied voting in with the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of women's suffrage. We still have some signs left if you have a naked front yard. Call Sally D. at 495-4349 to get a free sign!





#### Before a videoconference:

- 1. You will need a tablet, smartphone, or computer that has a microphone and headphones. You will have the opportunity to check your audio immediately upon joining a meeting.
- 2. You will receive a link to the conference call. The notification will include a link to "Join via computer" It will also include the 10-digit (usually) Meeting ID.

#### To join the videoconference:

- 1. At the start time of your meeting, click on the link in your invitation to join via computer. You may be instructed to download the Zoom application.
- 2. You have an opportunity to test your audio at this point by clicking on "Test Computer Audio." Once you are satisfied that your audio works, click on "Join audio by computer."

You may also join a meeting without clicking on the invitation link by going to join.zoom.us on any browser and entering the Meeting ID provided.

#### **VOTING OPTIONS AND DATES**

The November 3, 2020, election may be one of the most critically important in our lifetimes. Given the COVID-19 Pandemic, many people may choose another voting option than that of voting at the polls on November 3, 2020. Critical dates for these options are listed below.

Check to see that your registration is current at <a href="https://iwillvote.com">https://iwillvote.com</a> Last day to register to vote is October 13, 2020.

The period to request an Application for an Absentee Ballot by Mail has begun and will close on October 23, 2020, at 5:00 pm. Request your Absentee by Mail Ballot at <a href="https://www.elections.virginia.gove/casting-a-ballot/absentee-voting/">https://www.elections.virginia.gove/casting-a-ballot/absentee-voting/</a>

The last day to request an Absentee Ballot IN-PERSON is October 31st at 5:00 pm.

Absentee ballots will be mailed to voters requesting them starting on September 18, 2020. Fill it out and send it back as quickly as you are comfortable in doing so. Absentee ballots must be postmarked by November 3, 2020.

Early Vote (Absentee in Person) begins September 19, 2020. Check with your local registrar to find early voting locations. You may contact <a href="https://www.elections.virginia.gov/casting-a-ballot-in person-voting/">https://www.elections.virginia.gov/casting-a-ballot-in person-voting/</a>.

The only Saturdays in October you can vote early are October 24<sup>th</sup> and October 31<sup>st</sup>. (Some localities may have more dates. Voters should check with their local registrars for those dates.)

Voting at the polls will begin at 6:00 am and conclude at 7:00 pm on November 3, 2020. You can find your local location by checking <a href="https://iwillvote.com">https://iwillvote.com</a>

Emergency Absentee Voting is available at any time prior to 2:00 pm on the day preceding the election if you were unable to meet the Vote by Mail application date for any of the following reasons:

your hospitalization or illness;

the hospitalization, illness, or death of a spouse, child, or parent; or other emergency found to justify receipt of an emergency absentee ballot.

If you requested an absentee ballot but decide to vote in person, take your ballot AND the envelope with you to your registrar's office in order to be able to vote in person.

People who vote absentee in person or at their polling place on election day must present an ID. No longer must it be a photo ID, but they must have one of the IDs listed on ELECT website.




The Overstory A Novel by Richard Powers
