It has been a historic year for women. Not only did the country elect the first woman Vice President, the Commonwealth of Virginia voted to ratify the Equal Rights Amendment, becoming the 38th state to do so, and thereby removing an important barrier to the inclusion of the ERA in the U.S. Constitution. On the other hand, women faced new challenges due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Virginia MOCA organized the Summer of Women suite of exhibitions in response to these advances and setbacks. Together, She Says: Women, Words and Power, Amplify, and Lauren Keim: Everyday Magic provide much needed platforms for the exploration of the rich and complex lives of women.

She Says presents the work of eight women artists who include text as a fundamental element of their art practice. Each one engages with text directly, navigating its power and reflecting its influence back to the viewer. They all move in and out of its flow, whether the text is from a poem, a religious tome, or simply something that is shouted on the street. They start with a personal history, a narrative that has deep roots in the written word.

#### **GETTING OUT THE VOTE**

As usual our Branch is an active participant in voter registration on the local campuses. Although we're not electing a President this year, local elections, often overlooked, are this year. We'll be electing our state delegates (the whole delegation), our Governor, Lt. Governor and Attorney General.

We have contacted the 2 colleges within Virginia Beach. We will staff (with your help) voter registration tables at Virginia Wesleyan from 11:30 - 1:30 on Tuesdays and Thursdays during September and we have a table in the Science Building at TCC on Wednesday, Sept. 22 from 11:30 - 1:30 and then from 6:30 - 7:30pm. Sally D. doesn't mind setting these up and taking registrations to the registrar, but she cannot be at each of these events (and, really, they're fun and she shouldn't hog all the fun!). #### **GREATEST NEEDS FUND**

Each calendar year, we are challenged to raise funds for AAUW "Greatest Need Fund" (GNF). Last year (2020) we raised \$3,307 for GNF and to keep our advancement star rating we need to raise \$3,638 in 2021. This is where we have slacked off, our branch has only raised \$625 so far from 3 donors. That leaves \$3013 left to raise by December 31, 2021. We usually raise about \$400 with the Autobell cards, so minus that we could easily make our goal if each member donate at least \$55 to the Greatest Need Fund. Thanks to all who have renewed their membership! Our branch membership is now up to 49 which reflects an 85% percent renewal. Congratulations! If you have not yet renewed, you can go online at AAUW.org or mail payment to Tammie Mullins-Rice, 1010 Barnacle Ct., Virginia Beach, VA 23451. Our dues total breaks down as National/\$62+state/\$15+branch/\$14=\$91.00. Make your check out to AAUW Virginia Beach with "2021-2022 dues" in the memo line. Remember that \$56 of the total is tax deductible as a charitable contribution.

Once we are back meeting in person, we will continue the *Bring A Friend* recruitment program. The best way to get a new member is a referral from a current member. Bring a friend to a meeting so she can experience our group and learn about AAUW firsthand. We announce our speakers in advance, so you can choose a program that will fit her interest. As an additional plus, you will get an extra ticket for the Holiday Gift Basket raffle or the May Banquet door prizes.

A few years ago, we had a recruitment event at a local library and invited the Members At Large (national members only) in Virginia Beach and Chesapeake. We hoped to convince them to join the branch. This event resulted in Barbara Woodlee joining the branch. Barbara is now a committed branch and state board participant. We thought we would do this again and invite the MALs along with members who have dropped out over the past few years. If a member dropped out two or more years ago, she would be eligible for the *Shape the Future Program*. So, anyone who did not renew their membership for the July 1, 2019 - June 30, 2020, year would be eligible this year for a 50% discount on their national dues. Do you have a friend who dropped her membership? Please, encourage her yourself or let us know and we will contact her. We are in the planning stage, so if you are interested in joining the party, just let us know.



The Overstory: A Novel by Richard Powers

The Overstory, winner of the 2019 Pulitzer Prize in Fiction, is a sweeping, impassioned work of activism and resistance that is also a stunning evocation of—and paean to—the natural world. From the roots to the crown and back to the seeds, the novel unfolds in concentric rings of interlocking fables that range from antebellum New York to the late twentieth-century Timber Wars of the Pacific Northwest and beyond. This is the story of a handful of people who learn how to see that world and who are drawn up into its unfolding catastrophe.



### Clara Schumann, The Artist and the Woman

This absorbing and award-winning biography tells the story of the tragedies and triumphs of Clara Wieck Schumann (1819–1896), a musician of remarkable achievements. At once artist, composer, editor, teacher, wife, and mother of eight children, she was an important force in the musical world of her time. To show how Schumann surmounted the obstacles facing female artists in the nineteenth century, Nancy B. Reich has drawn on previously unexplored primary sources: unpublished diaries, letters, and family papers, as well as concert programs. Going beyond the familiar legends of the Schumann literature, she applies the tools of musicological scholarship and the insights of psychology to provide a new, full-scale portrait.


