Elizabeth Malcolm, Professor of Ocean and Atmospheric Sciences and Director of Sustainability at Virginia Wesleyan University, will highlight some of the ways that Virginia Wesleyan University (VWU) encourages women to study science. Virginia Wesleyan University, a liberal arts college, prides itself on providing small classes and faculty mentoring to a diverse undergraduate population. Currently 59% of our students are women, 26% are Black or African American, and 12% identify as Hispanic. In the Joan P. Brock School of Mathematics and Natural Science, 62% of faculty are women. Elizabeth will discuss programs such as the VWU Environmental Institute, which brings rising 9th grade girls to campus for a summer research program, the Downstream Collaborative which brings elementary aged students to campus for environmental science activities, and the Batten Honors College which provides funding and study away experiences for 40 incoming first year

students. She will also discuss her experiences mentoring research students in projects ranging from a citizen science campaign measuring

the urban heat island to measurements of mercury in bottlenose

Dr. Elizabeth Malcolm is a Professor in the Department of Earth and Environmental Sciences and the Director of Sustainability at Virginia Wesleyan University. She received her B.A. in Environmental Science from Earlham College and her Ph.D. in Atmospheric Science from the University of Michigan's College of Engineering. Before joining the faculty at Virginia Wesleyan, she was a Postdoctoral Research Associate at Princeton University in the Department of Geosciences. Her research primarily focuses on the environmental transport and chemistry of pollution, particularly mercury and trace metals.

AAUW FACTS

I have been asked to write a short article on the history of AAUW as we celebrate the 140th anniversary of the founding of AAUW on November 28.

- Seventeen women college graduates met at Massachusetts Institute of Technology on November 28, 1881, where they voted to organize an association of women college graduates. After inviting others like themselves to join them and 65 responded, the Association of College Alumnae was formed on January 14, 1882. Members paid an annual dues of \$.50.
- The first fellowship of \$350 was awarded to Ida M. Street in 1887. A Vassar graduate, she used the money to do research at the University of Michigan.
