Walking for a Purpose

The Sentara "Don't Sit on Colon Cancer" 5k and Walk will be held from 9 am – Noon on March 22, 2025 at the Princess Anne Hospital, 2025 Glenn Mitchell Dr. Virginia Beach, VA 23456.

It is a special event focused on getting the word out about colorectal cancer prevention and life-saving screenings. The race brings together survivors, family, friends and community supporters who are passionate about fighting colon cancer.

Colon Cancer Statistics From the American Cancer Society: "The American Cancer Society's estimates for the number of colorectal cancers in the United States for 2025 are:

About 107,320 new cases of colon cancer (54,510 in men and 52,810 in women) About 46,950 new cases of rectal cancer (27,950 in men and 19,000 in women)

The rate of people being diagnosed with colon or rectal cancer each year has dropped overall since the mid-1980s, mainly because more people are <u>getting</u> <u>screened</u> and changing their <u>lifestyle-related risk factors</u>. From 2012 to 2021, incidence rates dropped by about 1% each year. But this downward trend is mostly in older adults. In people younger than 50 years of age, rates have increased.

- 1. Resident of Virginia Beach
- 2. At least 23 years of age or older
- 3. Be currently enrolled in an undergraduate program in Hampton Roads and have completed a minimum of 12 credit hours at an accredited two- or four-year institution (this does not include accredited career colleges)
- 4. Have returned to school after a lapse of time
- 5. Have a G.P.A. of 2.75 or greater.

SCHOLARSHIP INSTRUCTIONS—READ CAREFULLY

1. All information submitted online or via the application form must be typed or printed.

2. The following information must be included:

*Latest official transcript that includes all grades from

college/university

*Two letters of recommendation:

One from a teacher; **One** from one of the following: <u>Counselor</u>, <u>employer</u>, <u>or clergy</u>

***Personal evaluation**- Provide in one page or less, information concerning career goals and any special circumstances or information that the scholarship committee should consider. Include any extra curricular activities (i.e., student government, awards, publications, clubs, associations, or community service).
